**SUMMARY:** The U.S. Department of Transportation's (DOT) Federal Transit Administration (FTA) announces the selection of projects with Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 appropriations for the Public Transportation on Indian Reservations Program (Tribal Transit Program) and provides administrative guidance on project implementation.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** This program is authorized by Section 5311(c)(1)(A) of Title 49, United States Code. Federal transit law authorized \$5 million for competitive allocations in FY 2020, in addition to \$3,017,310 in unallocated prior year funding. On May 26, 2020, FTA published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) (85 FR 31593) announcing the

availability of \$5 million in competitive funding under the Tribal Transit Program. Eligible applicants included federally recognized Indian tribes or Alaska Native villages, groups, or communities as identified by the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI) Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA). These program funds will provide financial assistance of capital, operating, and planning projects to support existing public transportation service or establish new public transportation services in rural areas. In response to the NOFO, FTA received 30 eligible project proposals requesting \$9,359,565. Project proposals were evaluated based on each applicant's responsiveness to the program evaluation criteria outlined in the NOFO. FTA is funding 25 projects as shown in Table 1 for a total of \$7,720,321.

Recipients selected for competitive funding should work with their FTA Regional Office to submit a grant application in FTA's Transit Award Management System (TrAMS) for the projects identified in the attached table to quickly obligate funds. Grant applications must only include eligible activities applied in the original project application. Funds must be used consistent with the competitive proposal and for the eligible purposes established in the NOFO and described in the FTA Circular 9040.1G.

In cases where the allocation amount is less than the proposer's total requested amount, recipients are required to fund only the eligible budget line item that corresponds to the allocation amount as described in the application. If the award amount does not correspond to the scalable option, for example due to the \$25,000 cap on the award amount for planning projects, the recipient should work with the Regional Office to reduce scope or scale the project such that a complete phase or project is accomplished. Recipients are reminded that program requirements such as cost sharing or local match can be found in the NOFO.

A discretionary project identification number has been assigned to each project for tracking purposes and must be used in the TrAMS application. Selected projects are eligible to incur costs under pre-award authority no earlier than the date projects were publicly announced, November 17, 2020. Pre-award authority does not guarantee that project expenses incurred prior to the award of a grant will be eligible for reimbursement, as eligibility for reimbursement is contingent upon other requirements, such as planning and environmental requirements, having been met. For more about FTA's policy on pre-award authority, please see the FTA Fiscal Year 2020 Apportionments, Allocations, and Program Information found in 85 FR 34285. Postaward reporting requirements include submission of the Federal Financial Report and Milestone Progress Reports in TrAMS as appropriate (see FTA C 5010.1E and C 9040 1G). Recipients must comply with all applicable Federal statutes, regulations, executive orders, FTA circulars, and other Federal requirements in carrying out the project supported by the FTA grant. FTA emphasizes that recipients must follow all third-party procurement guidance, as described in FTA C 4220 1F. Funds allocated in this announcement must be obligated in a grant by **September 30, 2023.**
