Nationwide Crime Trends, 2021 - 2022

Crime is a national concern that impacts America's transit systems. Public transit agencies should remain mindful of crime in their communities to take appropriate countermeasures. The FBI's most recent Uniform Crime Reporting Program report estimates nationwide from

2021 to 2022:

Violent crime decreased 1.7 percent.

Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter decreased 6.1 percent.

Aggravated assault decreased 1.1 percent.

Robbery increased 1.3 percent.

Property crime increased 7.1 percent

Larceny-theft offenses increased 7.8 percent.



Urbanized Area Formula Grants Program (Section 5307)

- Construction/rehabilitation of new/existing facilities to promote increased sightlines

Crime Prevention and Security Projects

- Increased lighting
- Increased camera surveillance

Public Transportation Safety and Security Operating Assistance Projects

- Salaries for personnel involved with security
- Contracts for security services

Formula Grants for Rural Areas Program (Section 5311)

Planning, operating and capital expenses to support prevention of operator assault

State of Good Repair Grants Program (Section 5337)

Capital security projects including security equipment and systems

Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (Section 5339)

- Rehabilitation
- Construction
- Lease of buses
- Bus facilities








Rail Transit Worker Assault Fatalities and Injuries, Jan 2014–Aug 2023


Anticipated Outcomes

- Help transit agencies and their joint labormanagement Safety Committees identify scalable and effective mitigations across a range of situations to lower the risks of worker assault
- Inform future Federal action to protect transit workers




Rail Suicide Event Fatalities and Injuries, Jan 2014–Aug 2023

Safety Advisory 22-4: Suicide Prevention Signage on Public Transit

- Published in the <u>Federal Register</u>
 December 7, 2022
- Encourages transit agencies to implement, update, or expand suicide prevention signage and messaging campaigns

Suicide on transit can impact everyone involved, including transit operators, transit leadership and the surrounding community. Research suggests suicide prevention signage is an intervention that can save lives. An example of San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District's (BART) signage


