Rail Transit Roadway Worker Protection (RWP) Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM)

The RWP Rule (49 CFR Part 671) would establish minimum RWP safety standards to prevent accidents, incidents, fatalities, and injuries to transit workers who may access tracks in the performance of their work.

Key Stakeholders:



Transit Workers who may access tracks in the performance of work



Rail Transit Agencies (RTAs) that operate Rail Fixed Guideway Public Transportation Systems



State Safety Oversight Agencies (SSOAs) responsible for overseeing those rail systems




