Flexible Funding for Transit Investments

What is it?

Broad authority granted to States and MPOs to transfer transportation funds from several Federal Highway Programs to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for support of transit activities.

Why do I need flexible funding?

- Increases pool of funding available for transit activities and projects
- Provides an integrated approach for meeting local and regional mobility needs
- Removes funding barriers to achieving more equitable and balanced transportation systems
- Supports resiliency, climate change and air quality goals
- Enables accessibility and ADA improvements to and around public transportation
- Advances implementation of Complete Streets policies, ensuring accommodation for all users
- Reduces project delivery costs through a more flexible and streamlined process
- Improves safety and security of the transit network
- Leverages a variety of formula funds for alternative financing

What are the steps involved to receive flexible funds?



- Identify the transit investment need
- Develop project and submit for consideration at regional or state level
- Confirm project eligibility with FTA/FHWA
- Add project to regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) or Statewide TIP



Initiate formal transfer process with state Department of Transportation (DOT)

 Coordinate with FTA direct recipient to add project to Program of Projects



Approve and send request to FHWA Headquarters

FHWA-FTA transfer funds (up to 60 days)

- Receive funds and FTA direct recipient submits grant application
- Obligate funding and manage federal award

Project is implemented

- **Project Sponsors:** Develop project, support flex request, may implement the project
- Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs): Regional stakeholder in the flexing process
- State DOTs: Principal grantee for FHWA funds, must submit request to flex to FHWA **Division Office**
- Transit Agencies: May be FTA direct recipient, may directly implement projects or establish agreement with subrecipient
- FTA: Approves flex request, oversees flexed projects
- FHWA: Approves flex request, transfers obligation authority to FTA
