PRESIDENT BIDEN'S BIPARTISAN INFRASTRUCTURE LAW

Every day in our country, nearly 21 million people take public transit to get where they need to go – to work and school, to see a doctor, to get to the grocery store, to places of worship, and more. On July 9, U.S. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg announced \$1.5 billion in awards through the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for 117 projects in 47 states that will improve bus transit and put more American-made buses on our roadways – part of the Biden-Harris Administration's unprecedented investment in public transit in communities of all sizes, including rural areas.

This funding will help transit agencies serve more riders, create jobs and train American workers on new technologies, and reduce air pollution in support of President Biden's goal of zero emissions by 2050.

2024 BUS INVESTMENTS:



1,150 new buses to be built by American workers across 47 states



50+ projects that will upgrade existing or build new transit facilities



80% of buses being funded will run on zero-or low-emission technology



\$817 million for projects committed to procuring standard model buses or using a joint procurement, which can shorten manufacturing timelines and contain costs



\$1.5 billion for transit agencies to buy U.S.-made buses and build and modernize bus facilities, including \$1.3 billion for low-or no-emission buses and supporting facilities or equipment



60+ rural transit agencies being funded for projects that will provide critical access to jobs, healthcare, and economic opportunities for rural communities



\$40 million for training, apprenticeship programs, and workforce development activities to ensure transit workers are trained on clean energy technologies
