Dear Ms. Richards,

Thank you and your team at the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) for submitting an action plan and implementation schedule addressing Required Action FTA-24-1-001-1 from Special Directive 24-1, "Required Actions to Protect Transit Workers at SEPTA." This Special Directive was issued as part of the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Safety Management Inspection (SMI) of SEPTA and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT). SEPTA submitted the documents, as required, on October 3, 2024.

Required action FTA-24-1-001-1 requires SEPTA to develop an action plan to safeguard the welfare of transit workers on the SEPTA system from assault on rail and bus transit modes.

# Approval of Action Plan and Implementation Schedule for Required Action FTA-24-1-001-1

FTA has reviewed the Transit Worker Welfare Protection Action Plan and Implementation Schedule and supporting documents and approves SEPTA's action plan and implementation schedule for FTA-24-1-001-1.

FTA finds that SEPTA's submission demonstrates a comprehensive approach to addressing transit worker safety through physical infrastructure improvements, enhanced security measures, expanded employee training, public education, and improved data collection. The implementation schedule outlines clear timelines and responsible parties for each action item.

# Conclusion

SEPTA should proceed with implementing the approved plan according to the provided schedule. FTA will monitor SEPTA's progress through regular updates and ongoing verification activities.

The attached Evaluation Matrix includes information on some of the verification activities FTA anticipates conducting as you implement your plan. These activities will allow FTA to comprehensively assess SEPTA's implementation of individual action items, ensuring they meet the commitments outlined in the action plan and implementation schedule. FTA may conduct additional verification activities as needed.

Pursuant to required action FTA-24-1-001-2, beginning 30 calendar days after the date of this letter, SEPTA must provide monthly progress reports on its implementation of the approved plan for FTA-24-1-001-1 until FTA closes required action FTA-24-1-001-1 or until otherwise notified by FTA.
