FTA's Human Trafficking Awareness and Public Safety Initiative Overview

- Supports U.S. DOT's Leaders Against Human Trafficking initiative
- Focuses on Training and Education, Public Awareness, Industry Engagement, Research, and Technical Assistance
- Two separate funding opportunities totaling \$4 million:
 - Innovations in Transit Public Safety Grant (\$2 million)
 - Crime Prevention and Public Safety Awareness Cooperative Agreement (\$2 million)



Innovations in Transit Public Safety

Eligible Projects

Projects that identify innovative solutions to:

- Reduce or eliminate human trafficking occurring at or through the use of transit systems,
- Protect transit operators from the risk of assault,
- Reduce crime on public transit vehicles and facilities, or
- Improve rider and public safety.

Eligible Applicants

- State and local government entities,
- Providers of public transportation,
- Non-profit organizations, or
- Consortium of entities, including providers of public transportation, that will share the costs, risks, and rewards of early deployment and demonstration of innovation.

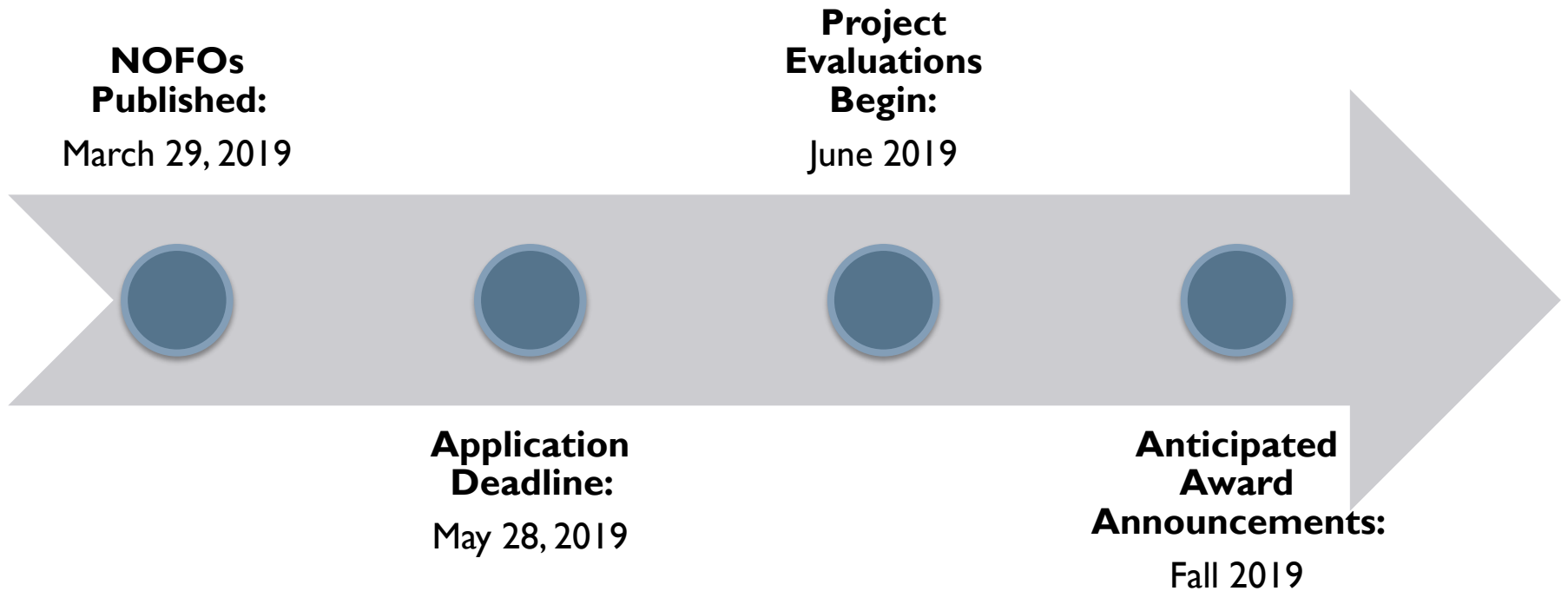
Eligible Subrecipients

- Public agencies,
- Private nonprofit organizations, or
- Private providers engaged in public transportation.

Crime Prevention and Public Safety Awareness

Eligible Projects	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Projects that include development and dissemination of technical assistance materials supporting transit public safety awareness campaigns that address:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Reducing or eliminating human trafficking occurring at transit systems or through the use of transit systems,○ Protecting transit operators from the risk of assault,○ Reducing crime on public transit vehicles and facilities, or○ Improving rider and public safety.
Eligible Applicants	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• National non-profit organizations, or• Organizations must have crime prevention experience, the capacity to provide public transportation-related technical assistance, and the ability to deliver a national public awareness campaign.
Eligible Subrecipients	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Public agencies,• Private non-profit organizations, or• Private providers engaged in public transportation.
