## **FTA Grade Crossing Definition**

#### **National Transit Database Glossary**

#### **Grade Crossing**

An intersection of a roadway and a rail right-of-way that cross each other at the same level (at grade). For street-running operations, each street intersection is considered a grade crossing (excludes driveways and parking lot entrances). Can be found in: A-20, S&S-40

The NTD data refers to Rail Grade Crossing as (RGX)



- Monthly transit agency reporting to the National Transit Database (NTD)









- Of those events, Light rail and Street car account for 97% of all RGX collisions
  - In 2015 there were 660 RGX collisions
  - In 2016 there was an increase to 780 RGX collisions
  - In 2017 there were 728 RGX collisions,
  - In 2018, there were 693 RGX Collisions
  - So far in 2019, there have been 320 RGX collisions








Injuries and Fatalities (RGX Collisions)
Jan. 2015- June 2019



 Light Rail (LR) accounts for 67% of all RGX Collisions and subsequently has the most injuries (727) and fatalities (56)







# Mitigation Strategies

- FTA Funding of Operation Lifesaver, Inc. (OLI)
  - Rail transit safety campaigns at 10 transit agencies received a funding boost thanks to a grant by Operation Lifesaver, Inc. (OLI). The \$175,000 in funding was awarded through OLI, but was provided by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) through a partnership the two entities share going back to 2002.
- FTA Staff serves on the One DOT Grade Crossing Committee
- FTA Staff serves on the National Committee on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (NCUTCD)
  - And the Railroad and Light Rail Transit Technical Committee (RR/LRT TC)
- Research Studies
  - Connected Vehicle (CV) Safety Technologies
    - Enhanced Pedestrian in Crosswalk Warning application is a warning system for operators of connected vehicles



# **Challenges**

- Mixed-use operating environments
- Intentional violations of traffic laws
- Trespassing
- Unintentional acts

- Implementation of Safety Management Systems (SMS)
- Implementation of the Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (PTASP)
